

One of these days I have to get organized. Have you ever said that? Is it something that only fly fishers worry about? Have you ever seen a person with a flyrod standing in a river with their box of flies in their hand, staring into it, as if hypnotized? You might think they're having trouble deciding which fly to use, and maybe they are. In my case I usually know which fly I want, I don't carry that many varieties, I simply can't find anything in my fly box. I have on occasion been accused of being a perfectionist and I wonder, have these people ever fished with me?

I'm a big fan of KISS. Not the band, the acronym; keep it simple stupid. Psychiatrists say that we have an inner child. My inner child is bratty, and self-destructive, and never puts anything back where he found it. I occasionally get a glimpse of other fly-fishers fly boxes, and I'm astounded. Everything is neatly laid out in rows and sorted by hook size, weight and color. Do they even fish at all? I can't figure it out. I organize my box at the beginning of each season, but in just a few trips, it's already scrambled. I only have a few boxes. I even have one that has dry fly compartments on one side, and a nymph holder on the other. What could be simpler than that? The dry flies, like the birds that the feathers come from, always migrate to other compartments. The Adams dries end up with the Elk Hair Caddis, The Sulfurs mix in with the Blue Wing Olives, the parachutes mix in with the Comparaduns. Try telling the difference between a size 20 Sulfur and a Blue Wing Olive during the evening hatch. I swear I put them in the right compartments when I clip them off.

When I first began to fly fish, I only carried one spool of 3x tippet. Eventually, I added more spools ranging from 0x to 6x. I like to rebuild my leaders as they wear down. Then fluorocarbon came along, and I ended up with even more tippet spools. I keep them all in a small chest pocket on my vest. When I want to add tippet to my leader, I reach into my vest and pull out the spools one at a time. I'm usually doing this while standing in a rushing river, balancing on slippery rocks, while holding my rod and wading staff under my armpit. I'm no scientist but there must be a law of physics that says that whatever size tippet spool you're looking for, will always be the last one that you pull out of the pocket. I only recently figured out that you're supposed to pull the tippet through the metal ring in the band that wraps around the spool. I guess that's why the front of my vest looked like a spider's web with strands of tippet going off in all directions.

I have some boxes of flies in my vest that I have never used. I call them the "what ifs". What if the guy next to you is catching fish one after another with a double winged, golden haired, klinkhammer, partridge emerger? It might be a good idea to have one just in case. One of my friends likes to fish with old school, classic wet flies. He does well with them, and they look like they would be lots of fun to tie. I'm not sure I could fit another fly box in my vest. Right now, it resembles George Costanza's overstuffed wallet, just before it exploded. I have this vision of the wet flies mixing in with the dry flies, or pushing their way into my nymph box. I mean, a person's got to draw the line somewhere. Am I right?

January Fly Tying Night Proposal from Bill Smith

Bill has an idea he would like us to consider for our annual fly tying night in January. He sent it in the body of an email so I will paste it below.

Members can tie their own patterns as in the previous Fly Tying Night and/or participate in the instructional sessions. 3 or 4 members will volunteer to lead participants in tutorials. Each instructor will demonstrate a specific fly. In the interest of simplicity I would suggest that all demonstrated flies should use the same hook (in this case a size 8 3xl nymph/streamer hook). The demonstrations will be shown on the screen using the clubs projector. I do a similar demonstration weekly at the Northport VA Hospital and have all of the necessary equipment and wiring.

- > Due to the wide range of member abilities (beginner to intermediate to expert) the demonstrated flies should be simple yet interesting- Sullyøs, Black Nosed Dace, Cypert Minnow, Shenks Minnow, Woods Special, etc.
- > Once the patterns to be demonstrated are determined by the instructors kits can be put together and sold to participants. I have the club materials at my house. I also have funds that were collected years ago during fly tying sessions that I can use to purchase any additional hooks and materials. Each kit will contain 6-8 hooks (2 hooks per fly) plus all materials. \$10 per kit any left over kits can be sold at the end of the night or at future meetings for \$5. I would recommend opening this session to non-members as a recruiting opportunity. Please contact me with any questions or suggestions.

A limited number of tying kits will be available to interested members. Each kit will contain hooks and materials for 2 of the demonstrated flies (total of 6 flies) and will be sold at the meeting for \$10. You can reserve your kits by emailing Bill at Elwoodff@gmail.com. If you would like to use your own hooks and materials you are welcome to do so. The components needed for the flies are listed below. Of course, if you would rather tie flies of your own, just watch, or simply chat with other members that would be great too. Everyone is welcome. If you are not a Fly Tyer, but would like to try it, Ed Kohler has offered to show novices how it's done. Vises, tools, and materials will be provided for new tiers so you will be able to tie your own fly!

Material list for the demonstrated flies. Feel free to substitute - use whatever you have.

Matuka

- 3xl #8 hook
- Lead wire
- XS wire for ribbing
- Dubbing
- 2 saddle hackle feathers about twice the hook length long
- 1 more matching feather for hackle

Slumpbuster

- 4xl #8 hook
- Large Cone
- Lead Wire
- Bodi Braid
- Rabbit Strip
- Wire rib

Sully's Darter

- 3xl #8 hook
- Mallard flank feathers (3 light and 1 dark)
- Front Hackle color of your choice
- Lead wire
- Bodi Braid

Please do not enter the park before 7:10 AM.

We will be restricting the number of fishermen on the river to 10 members per session.

All members that want to fish must register with **Ted bany** by phone, email or text; **first come first served**; he will confirm your reservation. If you need to cancel please do so 72 hours prior to **Monday, Jnuary 20** so that your reservation can be offered to another Flyrodder on the wait list. Please call, text, or email Ted at 631-513-5875 or tedbany@yahoo.com

Members are restricted to one fishing session in order to give more LIFR members an opportunity to fish. You might be able to fish a second session if we fail to get 10 fishermen at each session. Ted will keep a waiting list to advise of another fishing session opportunity if requested.

At the park please place \$25.00 in cash in an envelope with your name on it; there will be a box available for collection.

Stewards for the day will be Ted Bany.

Night/Sport Fishing Permit: The New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation . Long Island Region - will be accepting dashboard permit applications until March 31, 2023. They will go back on sale **September 7 through December 31, 2024**. There will be no mail-in or in-person sales. One application can be used for multiple permit requests for the same vehicle. Permit(s) will be mailed to the address indicated on the application. For questions, please call the Permit Department at (631) 321-3770.

To purchase a 2023 Dashboard Permit Apply online through DocuSign: visit *parks.ny.gov*, Long Island Region to apply. Valid credit card is required for payment. Permit(s) will be mailed once processed.

Fees are as follows and determined by issuing state of the applicants drivers license:

4 X 4 FISHING \$80 (NY resident), \$125 (out of state)

CAMP HERO FISHING \$40 (NY resident), \$75 (out of state)

NIGHT/SPORT FISHING \$35 (NY resident), \$60 (out of state)

To purchase a Night/Sport Fishing permit.

YOU MUST HAVE THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS WHEN APPLYING:

- 1. Valid e-mail address
- 2. Valid drivers license of the applicant
- 3. Valid vehicle registration and license plate information
- 4. Valid NYS DEC Recreational Saltwater/Marine Fishing Registry ID # (required for fishing dashboard permits).

I've been dealing with **Trident Fly- fishing**


(<u>www.tridentflyfishing.com</u>) out of Massachusetts and found an interesting hatch guide for multiple states and streams within each state that might be useful to club members.

If you are not a business and you have a bag of line, send it to the following address. Remember that birds and marine animals become entangled in fishing line. Do what you can. Make sure the line is clean of debris, hooks, and metal attachments.
